SUNDAY SERVICE REFLECTION

TALK IT OVER WITH KIDS

- Talk about some of your favorite memories you've experienced. What made them so fun?
- Not all of our memories are fun. Some of our memories include sadness—like when we've hurt other people. Do you find it hard to forget those memories? Why or why not?
- What do you think it means that Jesus doesn't keep a record of our past mistakes? Take a moment to pray and thank Jesus for his goodness and forgiveness!
