Scripture

Judges 13:1-5, 24-25, Judges 16:4-5, 18-22, 25-30, Luke 9:23, Hebrews 11:32-33

Summary

All of us are skilled at lying to ourselves. But we write the story of your life one wise or unwise decision at a time. We need to start telling ourselves the truth so we can live a regret-free life!

Talk it Over

- What part of today's sermon stood out to you the most? Why do you think God is putting that specific part on your mind and heart?
- Think of a previous time when you lied or were less-than-truthful. Why did you hide the truth?
- Be honest, what is an area of your life (e.g. finances, relationships, career) that you convince yourself isn't as bad as it really is?
- What do you think it means to "daily die" to your Self? What does that look like in practice?
- Who are some people you can trust to help you identify your "wisdom blind spots" in your life?
- What steps will you take to address those blind spots and start living a better, honest story?
